## SAYRA APPEALS PROCEDURE

(See Racing Rules of Sailing, Appendix F)

Members of SAYRA-member organizations and members of other YRA-member organizations may appeal a decision rendered by any protest committee within the jurisdiction of SAYRA when they believe that there has been a misinterpretation or misapplication of the rules by the protest committee. The SAYRA appeal process is available to members of organizations that do not belong to SAYRA or another YRA on payment of a twenty-five (\$25.00) dollar fee.

It is emphasized that the facts found by a protest committee are final and that disagreement on the facts is not a basis for an appeal (RRS 70.1)

The procedure for filing and processing an appeal to the SYRA Appeals Committee is as follows:

- 1. The appellant must submit to the Chairman of the SAYRA Appeals Committee, within 15 days after receipt in writing of the decision being appealed, a written NOTICE OF APPEAL. The notice (normally a letter) shall state the grounds for the appeal, i.e., the appellant's reasons for believing that the rules were misinterpreted or misapplied. A copy of the appeal shall be sent to the Secretary of SAYRA.
- 2. All of those documents listed in the RRS Appendix F (US Sailing Prescription) APPEALS PROCEDURES F2.2 (a) through (e) shall be included with the appeal.
- 3. Upon receipt of an appeal, the Appeals Committee shall send a copy of the appeal to the committee whose decision is being appealed, asking it for the documents in Rule F2.2 not supplied by the appellant.
- 4. The Appeals Committee shall send to all parties to the hearing, and to the protest committee whose decision is being appealed or reviewed, copies of all documents and comments it has received, except those supplied by that party or committee.
- 5. The Protest Committee and all parties to the protest may submit to the Chairman of the SAYRA Committee within 15 days of receipt of the appeal, their observations on the merits of the appeal.
- 6. The Chairman of the SAYRA Appeals Committee will furnish all parties, copies of any observations received. Within 15 more days, any party may correct any deficiencies in material previously submitted.
- 7. The Chairman of the SAYRA Appeals Committee will distribute copies of all pertinent materials to the Committee and designate at least three members to review and rule on the appeal.
- 8. Copies of the decision will be furnished the appellant, other parties, the chairman of the Protest Committee and the Secretary of SAYRA

## THE LNYC CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP, THE HEWSON TROPHY

Presented by the late Commander H.M. Hewson, USN

#### 1. GENERAL RULES

To be awarded to the best all-around sailor in the club. The club champion must have exhibited proficiency in several classes of boats and must have met the club's minimum participation requirements in club races prior to the championship races. The club Fleet Captain will establish a series of races to determine the Club Champion using several classes of boats. The Hewson Committee will govern participation. The Series will be designed to produce equal round robin competition as far as possible.

## 2. REGULATIONS

- A. Participants The club Fleet Captain should strive to involve the maximum number of participants in the Champion Series consistent with the available boats having equal sailing characteristics.
- B. Allotment of boats Skippers will be assigned to boats by lot and cannot sail their own boats or draw the same boat twice.
- C. Sailing rules and scoring The IYRU rules as adopted by US Sailing and the current LNYC sailing instructions govern the Series. In each race, the class rules of the boats will be observed. Crews shall remain consistent throughout the Series as far as the class rules for the various boats will allow. Appeals on protest judgments will not be entertained.
- D. Entries These will be selected by the Hewson Committee.

#### 3. GOVERNING AUTHORITY

The Hewson Committee, being the Club Fleet Captain, the Commodore, and the immediate Past Commodore, will decide any matters not covered herein.

## 2008 NOTICE OF RACE LNYC AROUND THE BUOYS COURSES

#### 1. DESCRIPTION

- 1.1 The 2008 Lake Norman Yacht Club Racing Season on the "Around the Buoys" course consists of 14 Club Series Race weekends as listed in the 2008 Lake Norman Yacht Club Yearbook Calendar.
- 1.2 A typical Club Series Race Weekend consists of up to three Saturday races and up to three Sunday races.

#### 2. RULES

LNYC Club Series Races will be governed by the *rules* as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing 2005-2008*. Participating boats shall comply with Class Rules.

#### 3. ELIGIBILITY

- 3.1 LNYC Club Series races are open to guests invited and hosted by a member of LNYC. Only the following are eligible for LNYC Club Series scoring or awards:
  - 3.1.1 LNYC Members
  - 3.1.2 Spouses of LNYC members
  - 3.1.3 Children and wards of LNYC members who are members of the LNYC Junior Program or who are 18-25 years of age and are dependents of a Club Member.
  - 3.1.4 Sailing Instructions may be downloaded from the Lake Norman Yacht Club website

#### 4. FUNDAMENTAL RULES AND SAFETY

- 4.1 Each competitor shall be familiar with the requirements of the RRS, including Part 1 "Fundamental Rules."
- 4.2 Sailing Instructions for the 2008 LNYC Around the Buoys Courses will be available in the basement of the LNYC Clubhouse before the start of the first race of the season.

## 5. STARTING TIMES

- 5.1 Competitors shall be prepared for a 1300 spring (4/6-6/1) 1030 summer (6/14-8/17) and 1300 fall (9/14-11/16) warning signal.
- 5.2 The starting system will be as described in the RRS 26.
- 5.3 No warning signal will be made after 1700 on Saturday or 1600 on Sunday.

#### 6. SCORING

- 6.1 Two boats will constitute a fleet.
- 6.2 "Low Point Scoring" as defined by RRS Appendix A4 will be used.
- 6.3 "Series Scores" will be computed as stated in *RRS* Appendix A2 and as stated under Section 7 "STANDINGS AND AWARDS" of this Notice of Race. Additionally, *RRS* Appendix A9, "Race Scores In a Series Longer Than a Regatta" will be in effect and is modified by deleting the last sentence.
- 6.4 Skippers not racing the sail # they are registered under for that fleet in the club series may be scored under their name, provided they have complied with the additional RC check in requirement as outlined in section 7 of the Sailing Instructions.

#### 7. STANDINGS AND AWARDS

## 7.1 Standings

- 7.1.1 Standings have qualifying criteria for both the fleet and the individuals or boats within the fleet.
- 7.1.2 Before a fleet is considered for awards, that fleet must participate in at least 50% of the Club Series Races sailed in that series.
- 7.1.3 In calculating the number of races required, decimals will be carried to one place. The values of 0.5 and greater will be rounded up to the nearest whole number, while 0.4 and lower will be rounded down to the nearest whole number.

#### 7.2 Awards

- 7.2.1 Each individual fleet using its own scoring method will make weekend awards for Club Series events.
- 7.2.2 Trophies for the Spring, Summer, and Fall Series shall be awarded in each qualified fleet.
  - 7.2.2.1 A boat's/individual's standing in the Spring, Summer and Fall Series shall be based on its best finishes in 60% of the races sailed by that fleet.
- 7.2.3 Trophies for overall Saturday, Sunday and Annual Series places shall be awarded in each qualified fleet.
  - 7.2.3.1 A boat's/individual's standing in the Saturday, Sunday and Annual series shall be based on its best finishes in 50% of the races sailed by that fleet.

#### 7.3 Trophies

The number of trophies awarded in each fleet depends on participation as follows:

If the vessel does not yet have a current LNKC PHRF Certificate, a temporary rating must be obtained by completing a Lake Norman Keelboat Council (LNKC) PHRF rating certificate, please submit pertinent vessel information to the LNKC at: ://www.lnkc.com/downloads.htm to have a provisional rating assigned. For vessels without a LNKC PHRF certificate, you are still eligible, but please contact Al Cleeland, LNYC Keelboat Fleet Captain at <a href="mailto:alan.cleeland@volvo.com">alan.cleeland@volvo.com</a> for a temporary rating. Failure to contact regarding a temporary rating will result in LNYC assigning a temporary rating for you based off general knowledge of your vessel. Ratings will not be changed once the series has begun. A boat shall not be scored until all entry requirements are met.

## 4. FEES & REGISTRATION

## 5. CLASSES

Entrants will be divided into Spinnaker and Non-Spinnaker Fleets and may be further divided into Divisions. Those entrants in the Non-Spinnaker fleet expressing a desire to do so will also be scored against others who choose to be grouped into a Cruiser Division.

## 6. RULES

This event will be governed by the "Rules" as outlined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), available at www.ussailing.org, except as altered by the Lakewide Sailing Instructions (LSI), available at www.lnkc.com, and these Sailing Instructions. Notices to competitors and changes to sailing instructions will be posted on the Lake Norman Yacht Club (LNYC) bulletin board located at www.lakenormanyachtclub.com (the club website).

## 7. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

Signals made ashore will be displayed from a mast located at the LNYC Clubhouse. Code flag "AP" displayed with two sound signals signifies that racing is postponed. The warning signals will not be made less than thirty (30) minutes after the lowering the "AP" with one sound signal.

## 8. COURSES & MARKS

The course marks as stated in the current LSI shall apply. RC may provide separate courses for the Spinnaker and the Non-spinnaker fleets by signaling the Spinnaker Course under Flag "S" and the Non-Spinnaker Course under Flag "N" on separate flagstaffs.

LNKC course marks and special marks will be used for the series races. The RC may replace a missing Channel Marker and/or Course Mark with a temporary floating mark. This temporary mark is to be respected as the Channel Marker or Course Mark it replaces. Special marks will be identified before the start of a race by the RC.

## 9. THE START

## Warning Signal at 1:55 PM 1<sup>st</sup> Start at 2:00 PM

The starting line will be in the vicinity of Marker D7 between a floating mark and the "RC" flagstaff on the Committee Boat, which, along with any limiting buoy and attachment line placed for the protection of it and its crew, is a starting mark. This changes the RRS definition for a mark only as it refers to the race committee boat. There will be one start for both fleets. The Class Flag will be the Numeral Flag 1. The Preparatory Signal will be the Flag P. Course signals and any flag that makes part of Rule 30 applicable will be displayed separate from the starting sequence signals. This changes RRS 26 and the Preparatory Signals in Race Signals.

## 10. THE FINISH

The finish line will be between the orange tetrahedron mark set in the mouth of the LNYC cove and the orange flag set on the RC boat or the LNYC dock nearby. Each yacht shall note her finish place in her class and overall.

## 11. SCORING

The Full Series, consisting of four (4) races, will be scored using the Time on Time Low Point Scoring System with the following exceptions, which change RRS A9. A boat that did not finish within the time limit or retired after finishing will be scored points one more than the number of boats that finished the race. A boat that did not start or was disqualified will be scored points one more than the number of boats that started the race. A boat's results for the entire series will be the total of her best race scores for all races conducted. Abandoned races will not be rescheduled.

## 12. TIME LIMIT & SHORTEN COURSE

The time limit to the first mark is waived for this event. This changes LSI Rule 14.1. There will be no shortened courses.

#### 13. PROTESTS

The Spring Invitational is intended to be a fun and friendly event. Competitors are encouraged to resolve all protests on the water according to the 'rules'. If a protest cannot be resolved on the water, the protesting party must inform the Committee Boat of their intent to submit a written protest before leaving the Race Area. Properly completed protest forms must be submitted to the Race Chairman or his/her designate at the after-race gathering on the LNYC patio no later than 9:30 PM on the day of the race. A protest hearing may convene immediately thereafter or may be scheduled for a later date. The weekly trophy for the affected fleet will not be awarded until all protests are resolved.

## 14. SAFETY

Each boat shall be equipped with safety gear, as required by federal, state, and local regulations. Running lights, as required, must be used during races continuing past sunset. Any boat retiring before finishing is required to inform the RC before leaving the racecourse.

## 15. TROPHIES

A trophy will be awarded each week to the first place finisher in each Fleet. Overall series trophies will be awarded following the end of the series on Saturday, May 10<sup>th</sup> with a cookout and party to follow. Additional trophies will be awarded based off entries, classes, and category.

## **15. CHANGING BOATS**

Participants who change boats during the series will be ineligible for the overall Series awards.

## **16. WEATHER CANCELATIONS**

If the race can reasonably be called off due to bad weather by 11 AM the morning of the race and all participants will be notified by email. Otherwise, the call will be made by the RC on the water.

## **ORGANIZING AUTHORITY:**

Lake Norman Yacht Club organizes the Junior Program Race Series.

## PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

The 2008 Junior Program Race Series will consist of races as listed in the 2008 LNYC Yearbook. The number of races for each race day will vary with conditions. The Race PRO will determine an appropriate number of races for each race day, and will strive to complete an odd number of races for each division.

## **RULES**:

Junior Program Race Series races are governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), applicable One-Design Class rules, the 2008 Junior Program Race Series Sailing Instructions and this Notice of Race.

## **CLASSES TO RACE**:

The classes to race are: Optimist Green Fleet; Optimist White, Red and Blue Fleets; Laser; Sunfish; and Club 420 with spinnakers and trapezes.

## **ELIGIBILITY**:

Children of members and sponsored children under 18 years old are eligible to sail in the Junior Program Race Series, provided they have completed Junior Program registration and waiver forms, including parent signature and paid the Junior program fees. Registration and waiver forms are required for all sailors.

## **SCORING:**

The Junior Program Series will be scored as a series of regattas. Except for Optimist Green Fleet, the Low Point Scoring System in RRS Appendix A will be used; and each sailor's overall series score will be the total of the best four regatta scores.

- Full and Radial rigged Lasers are scored as one fleet
- Optimist Green Fleet is scored separately from the other Optimist Fleets based on participation only.
- Optimist White, Blue and Red Fleets are scored overall and by fleet.
- The Optimist Championship is awarded to the sailor with the lowest overall point total at the end of the series.
- Optimist Fleet Awards are presented to the Optimist sailors in each fleet with the lowest point totals at the end of the series. See "Awards" for the number of awards presented to each fleet.
- The sailor's age on the date of the last race of the series will be used for Optimist fleet placement and scoring.

## **BY-LAWS OF LAKE NORMAN YACHT CLUB**

(Amended 2007)

#### **ARTICLE I**

This club is organized as a non-profit corporation under the laws of the State of North Carolina, and reference is hereby made to the terms and provisions of the Charter of The Club issued by the Secretary of North Carolina. For purposes of convenience, the corporation is referred to in these By-Laws as the "Club."

## ARTICLE II **MEMBERSHIP**

## Sec. 1. CLASSES OF MEMBERS.

Members of the Club shall be classified as RESIDENT, NON-RESIDENT AFFILIATE, HONORARY, SURVIVOR, and STUDENT MEMBER. All members shall be at least 21 years of age, except a STUDENT MEMBER, who shall be at least 18 years of age.

#### Sec. 2. RESIDENT MEMBERS.

A RESIDENT MEMBER is a person who is paying Resident Membership dues. Such member shall be entitled to all voting rights, and to hold an elective office except as hereinafter provided.

## Sec. 3. RESIDENT MEMBER'S DEPENDENTS.

A RESIDENT MEMBER'S spouse and dependents, residing within the member's household, or a full-time student, shall be entitled to the privileges of the Club. Such spouses and dependents of a member shall have no vote and shall be subject to such restrictions as the Club's rules and regulations may impose.

## Sec. 4. NON-RESIDENT MEMBERS.

The classification of NON-RESIDENT MEMBER is created to accommodate those Resident Members who have relocated beyond the residential area of the Club and wish to maintain contact with LNYC and its activities. This classification of membership will allow the NON-RESIDENT MEMBER, whose principal residence is not within the residential area of the Club. and his or her family, to use the Club facilities no more than eight weekend days and holidays per calendar year and be included in the LNYC Yearbook and LNYC mailing list. Such member shall be entitled to all other rights and privileges of the Club except that they may not vote, hold office, or maintain a boat at the Club except on weekends and holidays when they are using the Club as provided above. The residential area of the Club is defined to be that area within a radius of 80 miles of the Clubhouse.

#### Sec. 5 NON-RESIDENT AFFILIATE MEMBER.

A NON-RESIDENT AFFILIATE MEMBER is a person who lives beyond the residential area of the Club, who makes major contributions to the sport of sailing on an on-going basis and wishes to be affiliated with LNYC. The Board of Directors may, at its discretion and for any reason, review a Non-Resident Affiliate Member's membership and determine if such membership status should granted and/or continued.

## Sec. 6. STUDENT MEMBER.

A STUDENT MEMBER is a person who is principally occupied as a full-time student. Such members are entitled to all rights and privileges of the Club excepting they may not hold office or vote.

## Sec. 7. HONORARY MEMBER.

An HONORARY MEMBER is a person who has made extraordinary contributions to the well-being of the Club and who has been elected to such membership by a vote of at least two-thirds of the Directors then in office.

HONORARY MEMBERS shall not be required to pay initiation fees or dues. Such members shall enjoy all rights and privileges of the Club, except that they may not vote or hold elective office.

## Sec. 8. SURVIVOR MEMBERS.

The widowed spouse of any member may, within 90 days following the death of such member, assume the membership status of such deceased member without further payment of initiation fees by notifying the Secretary of the Club. Alternatively, such widowed spouse may elect within 90 days following the death of such member to become a SURVIVOR MEMBER. A SURVIVOR MEMBER shall have all rights and privileges of the Club excepting that he or she may not vote nor hold office and shall not be required to pay dues or initiation fees.

## Sec. 9. RESIGNATION OF MEMBERSHIP

Resignation of membership to the Club shall be made by submitting a letter of resignation to the Secretary; however, no such resignation shall release such member from any liability for indebtedness to the Club. Sec. 10. EXPULSION FROM MEMBERSHIP OR DISCIPLINARY ACTION.

- (A) A member may be expelled from the membership of the Club, or disciplined otherwise.
  - (1) For failure to pay dues, assessments, fines or any other monetary obligation to the Club.
  - (2) For conduct or acts found to be unbecoming to a member of the Club, or detrimental to the best interests of the Club, or to render the member unfit and unworthy to continue his or her membership in the Club.
  - (3) For failure on two occasions to serve or to provide an adult substitute on the Race Committee when appointed.
- (B) No member shall be expelled from the Club or otherwise disciplined under the provisions of sub-section (A) above, except by vote of at least two-thirds of the Board of Directors and until he or she has been informed of any and all charges of deficiencies in writing and has been given an opportunity to be heard in respect to such charges or deficiencies at a meeting of the Board of Directors.

## Sec. 11. PROPOSALS FOR MEMBERSHIP.

- (A) All proposals for each class of membership shall be in writing on an application form prescribed by the Directors and signed by a sponsoring Resident Member and the proposed member. Each completed application form shall be submitted to the Chairman of the Membership Committee and accompanied by letters of recommendation from the sponsor and at least one other Club member.
- (B) Upon receipt of a completed application and letters referred to in sub-paragraph (A) above, the Chairman of the Membership Committee shall, as soon as practicable, notify the membership in writing of such proposal for membership.
- (C) Within thirty days after such written notice, members of the Club may register in writing with the Membership Committee Chairman, any protest against the acceptance of the person proposed for membership.
- (D) The Membership Committee shall consider and vote on all persons proposed for Membership as provided above; provided, however, that no such vote shall be taken on applicants for MEMBERSHIP until such applicant shall have first personally met the Chairman of the Membership Committee and two other members of the Committee. It shall be the duty of the applicant's sponsor to arrange such meeting with the Membership Chairman at the latter's convenience.
- (E) Upon approval of an application for membership by a majority of the Membership Committee, the Chairman thereof shall promptly communicate such approval to the Board of Directors for consideration. A two-thirds vote of the Directors shall be required to approve a new member.
- (F) Providing they meet all other criteria to become a Resident Member, as set by the Board of Directors, the Board shall give priority to the following in filling vacancies for Resident membership: (1) Non-Resident Member; (2) Student Member; (3) Children of an active member of any class in no particular order. Any priorities beyond these will be determined by the Board of Directors.
- (G) Acceptance to membership shall be communicated to the applicant and his or her sponsor in writing along with a bill for the initiation fees and dues. Membership shall become effective if such monies as may be required are received by the Treasurer within 30 days.

## Sec. 12. MILITARY LEAVE.

Military leaves of absence may be granted by the Board of Directors upon such terms and conditions as it may consider proper.

## ARTICLE III

## **BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

## Sec. 1. MEMBERS OF THE BOARD.

The Club shall be governed and managed by a Board of Directors which shall consist of persons holding the offices of Commodore, Vice-Commodore, Rear Commodore, Fleet Captain, Secretary, Treasurer, the two immediate past Commodores, one member to be elected at large, a member who will serve as an assistant to the Treasurer, and the Junior Program Chairman.

The Junior Program Chairman shall be nominated by the Nominating Committee from a list of not fewer than four (4) names which shall be presented to the Nominating Committee by the officers and/or advisors and/or members of the Junior Program or Committee.

Directors shall hold office for a term of one calendar year, beginning on January 1 following the Annual Meeting at which they are elected or otherwise determined. If, for any reason, Directors shall not be elected at any Annual Meeting, the incumbent Directors shall continue to serve until the election and qualification of their successors.

#### Sec. 2. VACANCIES.

Vacancies in the Board of Directors occurring during the term of office for which they were elected shall be filled by the remaining Directors, and the persons elected to fill such vacancies shall serve the entire unexpired term of the Board Members. Should the Past Commodore position become vacant, the person elected to that office shall have previously served a term on the Board and preferably shall be a Past Commodore.

Should a member of the Board of Directors be elected to an office which carries membership on the Board of Directors, such member should relinquish his previous position on the Board and the vacancy left by such member shall be filled at the same meeting at which the member is elected an officer. The new Board member filling such vacancy shall serve the entire unexpired term of the replaced Board Member.

#### Sec. 3. GENERAL POWERS.

The Board of Directors shall, subject only to action taken by members at their meetings, have complete control and authority in the management of the Club, and shall have general control over its properties and policies.

## Sec. 4. AUTHORITY OVER COMMITTEES.

The Board of Directors shall have general authority and control over all committees, and may at any time require a report from any committee.

## Sec. 5. MINUTES AND REPORTS.

The Secretary shall keep minutes of the Board Meetings. Said minutes shall be available for the members to read upon request to the Secretary; provided, however, discussion on election of proposed members and details of charges preferred against members shall be held in strict confidence by the Directors.

## Sec. 6. RESTRICTIONS ON BORROWING.

The Directors and Officers shall not without first securing the approval of the members as hereinafter provided have the right to borrow long-term funds or to issue bonds for the Club, or to impose any lien, charge or pledge, on the properties of the Club. No such action shall be taken unless it is first specifically authorized by the members by a vote of at least three-fourths of those present at the annual meeting or at a special meeting called for that purpose as provided in Article VI. For the purpose of these By-Laws, long-term borrowing shall be defined as that which has a term of debt longer than one calendar year from closing date. The

Directors shall have, at their discretion, the power to borrow short-term funds for periods of less than one year provided such borrowing is deemed repayable out of the anticipated current year revenues of the Club.

## Sec. 7. RESTRICTIONS ON SELLING PROPERTY

The Directors and Officers shall not sell the Club's real property or any interest therein, nor lease the same for more than one year, without first securing the approval of the members as hereinafter provided. Such action shall be taken only if it is specifically authorized by a vote of at least three-fourths of the members present at the annual meeting or at a special meeting called for that purpose as provided by Article VI.

#### Sec. 8. RESTRICTIONS ON MEMBERSHIP LIMIT

- (A) The membership limit of Resident Members is 285. The Board of Directors may increase the limit by up to 15 resident members.
- (B) In the event an increase in the membership limit beyond that allowed in Paragraph A is deemed necessary, approval of a majority of the members present at the Annual Meeting or at a special meeting called for that purpose as provided in ARTICLE VI is required.
- (C) Any proposal to increase the membership level beyond that allowed in Paragraph A shall be accompanied by an assessment of the financial impact, facility capacity, and any other factor that could affect the well being of the Club, and purpose of the Club as stated in it's charter.

## Sec. 9. MEETINGS OF DIRECTORS.

The Board of Directors shall meet at least once every quarter upon the call of the Commodore or upon the call of any five members of the Board at such time and place as may be designated. Notice of all meetings shall be given to the members of the Board, either orally or in writing, but the failure of any director to receive notice shall not invalidate any action taken at the meeting, provided a quorum is present. Five members of the Board shall constitute a quorum, provided at least one of the members present is the Commodore, Vice Commodore, or Rear Commodore; provided further, however, that no person shall be admitted to membership unless approved by at least two-thirds of the Directors of the Club. Unless otherwise provided in the charter or these By-Laws, questions acted upon at meetings of the Board of Directors shall be determined by a majority vote of the Directors present at such meeting.

## Sec. 10. RULES AND REGULATIONS.

The Board of Directors may adopt and promulgate House Rules and other rules and regulations to be observed by the members.

## ARTICLE IV

## **OFFICERS**

## Sec. 1. NUMBER OF OFFICERS.

The officers of the Club shall consist of a Commodore, Vice-Commodore, Rear Commodore, Fleet Captain, Secretary and Treasurer. Officers shall be elected at the Annual Meeting and shall take office on the following January 1 and shall serve for one calendar year.

#### Sec. 2. VACANCIES

In the event of a vacancy between the Annual Meeting and the end of the term for any office in the Club, such vacancy shall be filled by the Directors, with respect to the unexpired term.

## Sec. 3. DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

- (A) The Commodore shall be the chief executive officer of the Club and shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors and of the members. He shall be an ex-officio member of all committees and shall perform all duties generally and customarily associated with the office of Commodore of yacht and boating clubs.
- (B) In the absence of the Commodore, the Vice Commodore shall preside at meetings of the Board of Directors and of members and shall carry out the functions and duties of the Commodore in the event of the latter's absence or inability to perform said functions and duties, or in the event he is requested to do so by the Commodore.
- (C) In the absence of the Commodore and Vice-Commodore, the Rear Commodore shall preside at meetings of the Board of Directors and shall carry out other functions and duties of the Commodore in the event of the absence of the Commodore and Vice-Commodore, or their inability to perform their functions and duties. The Rear Commodore shall perform such other duties as may from time to time be directed by the Commodore or by the Board of Directors.
- (D) The Fleet Captain shall preside at all meetings of the Fleet Captain's committee. In his absence the Fleet Captain shall appoint a committee member to serve as Chairman. The Fleet Captain shall be a member of the Racing Committee and shall represent the club fleets on that committee.
- (E) The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the Board of Directors and of the meetings of members, shall carry on correspondence on behalf of the Club, and shall perform all other acts incident to the position of Secretary, subject to control of the Board of Directors. The Secretary shall also maintain a complete and up-to-date roster of the members of the Club and the boats in the Club, and shall be custodian of the official records of the Club other than the financial records.
- (F) The Treasurer shall have charge of the funds of the Club and shall maintain adequate records of receipts and disbursements and other financial records. He shall make reports to the Commodore and to meetings of the Board of Directors and of members at such times as he may be requested to do so. He shall deposit all funds in the name of the Club in such depository or depositories as may be designated and approved by the Board of Directors, and he may withdraw and write checks against said funds in such manner as may be approved by the Board of Directors. He shall perform all other acts incident to the office of Treasurer, subject to the control of the Board of Directors. He shall give such bond for the faithful performance of his duties as the Board of

Directors may require, if the Board of Directors shall elect to require such a bond, such bond to be paid out of the operating funds of the Club.

## ARTICLE V COMMITTEES

## Sec. 1. STANDING COMMITTEES.

All standing committees shall be subject to control of and report to the Board of Directors. The Commodore shall be an ex-officio member of all standing committees. The Club shall have the following standing committees:

## (A) Fleet Captain's Committee.

- (1) Each Fleet shall elect a Resident Member, preferably its particular Fleet Captain, to serve on the Fleet Captain's Committee.
- (2) This Committee shall promulgate and enforce all boating and safety regulations of the Club. It shall have direct control over the scheduling of all club racing activities including the selection of dates and starting times, the planning of club series and the coordination of all invitational regattas. Each committee member shall serve a term of one year.
- (3) The Chairman of the Fleet Captain's Committee shall be the Club Fleet Captain.
- (4) All decisions of this Committee shall be made by a simple majority vote.

#### (B) Racing Committee.

- (1) The Racing Committee shall have direct control over all races sailed under the auspices of the Club. Their responsibilities shall include the development and promulgation of all required sailing instructions; the assignment of club members to serve on race and protest committees; the development of programs to encourage and monitor member activity in the area of race management; the selection of race managers and judges for all regattas; and the control of all race management equipment and supplies other than watercraft and docks.
- (2) The Committee shall consist of the Club Fleet Captain (not an appointed member) plus six resident members, two appointed each year by the Commodore from a list of not fewer than four nominees proposed by the Racing Committee. Each appointed member shall serve a term of three years.
- (3) The Chairman of the Racing Committee shall be appointed each year by the Commodore from among the two most senior appointed Racing Committee members.

## (C) Long-Range Planning Committee.

- (1) The Long-Range Planning Committee shall be responsible for soliciting the views of the Members about the long-range development of the Club's activities, organization, By-Laws, programs, facilities and financing, and reporting such views to the Board of Directors. On or before the Annual Meeting of the Club, the Committee shall submit a written report to the incoming Board of Directors and to the membership recommending a long-range program and capital costs for developing the Club. The recommendations in this report may include, but are not limited to, long-range improvements in the Club's objectives, programs, activities, organizational structure, By-Laws, physical facilities and equipment.
- (2) The Committee shall consist of nine Resident Members of the Club. The chairman shall be elected by the Committee. The members shall be appointed by the Commodore, with the advice and consent of the Board of Directors for a regular three-year term, with the terms of such members staggered so that the regular terms of three members shall terminate each year and three new members shall be appointed each year to fill the vacancies. The first such Committee shall have three members appointed for one year, three members for two years, and three members for three years. Not more than two members of this committee shall at any time be members of the Board of Directors, and should a member of this committee be elected to the Board of Directors under circumstances where two members of the committee are already members of the Board, he or she shall resign from this committee as a condition precedent to assuming membership on the Board.

## (D) Nominating Committee.

The Nominating Committee shall consist of the Commodore, the immediate Past Commodore and five Resident Members not serving on the Board of Directors, three to be selected by the Commodore and two by the immediate Past Commodore. The Committee shall be selected by June 1 of each year and its names published in the next issue of the Club's Newsletter. The Committee shall select its own Chairman, but neither the Commodore nor the immediate Past Commodore shall be eligible for such position. The Committee having notified the nominees and received their consent shall then present its slate for officers and other Board Members for the ensuing year to the Board of Directors, and then cause the slate to be published in the Club's Newsletter or other mailing at least 30 days prior to the Annual Meeting. In the event a nominee on the slate becomes ineligible to serve after the slate has been published to the membership, the Committee shall have the power to offer into nomination the name of a substitute nominee.

#### (E) Membership Committee.

The Membership Committee shall consider all proposals for membership in accordance with the provisions of these By-Laws and make recommendations to the Board of Directors concerning the Club's membership. The Committee shall consist of a Chairman, who shall be the member at large, and four other members elected by the Board of Directors.

#### (F) Audit Committee.

The first year the Commodore shall appoint an Audit Committee consisting of three Resident Members. One member shall serve for a one-year term, the second member for a two-year term and the third member for a three-year term. Succeeding Commodores shall appoint one Resident Member to the Audit Committee to replace the retiring member. No member shall serve consecutive terms. This Committee is charged with reviewing the financial accounts of the Club each December 31 and at such other times as the Committee or the Commodore determines. It shall also have the authority to call for an audit when it deems it appropriate.

## (G) Design Review Committee

The Design Review Committee shall analyze proposals for capital improvement projects referred to it by the Board of Directors. It will report findings and give recommendations to the Board of Directors regarding the design feasibility and practicality of such projects. The regular Committee shall consist of three Resident Members of the Club. The Chairman shall be elected by the Committee. It will be his or her responsibility to solicit temporary committee members from the Club membership based on their expertise relative to the project(s) under consideration. These temporary members shall have full voting authority for the duration of their assignment.

The regular members shall be appointed by the Commodore, with the advice and consent of the Board of Directors for a three year term, with the terms of such members staggered so that the term of one member shall terminate each year and a new member appointed to fill the vacancy. The first such Committee shall have three members with each appointed for a one, two or three year term. No member of this committee shall at any time be a member of the Board of Directors, and should a member of this committee be elected to the Board of Directors, he or she shall resign from this committee as a condition precedent to assuming membership on the Board.

#### Sec. 2. OTHER COMMITTEES.

The Commodore may appoint additional committees as is deemed necessary to conduct the activities of the Club.

#### Sec. 3. REPORTS.

Each Committee shall prepare appropriate procedures covering the activities under its supervision for approval by the Board of Directors. Each Committee Chairman shall, if appropriate, at each Annual Meeting make written reports of his or her committee's activities during the year.

## **ARTICLE VI**

## MEETINGS OF MEMBERS

## Sec. 1. SCHEDULED MEETINGS.

An Annual Meeting of the membership shall be held each year during the month of September or October, which meeting shall be for the purpose of conducting the Club's business and election of officers and Directors. Additionally, a Spring Meeting will be scheduled during March or April each year by the Board of Directors at which time the Commodore and Board of Directors will report to the membership generally with respect to the plans for the remainder of the year. At least 15 days' notice of, and an agenda for, the Annual Meeting shall be given to all members by mail, but the failure of any member or members to receive such notice shall not invalidate action taken at such meeting, provided a quorum is present. One-fourth of the Club's Resident Members in good standing shall constitute a quorum.

## Sec. 2. ORDER OF BUSINESS.

The order of business at the Annual Meeting of the Club shall include the following:

- 1. Reading of minutes of the last Annual Meeting and of special meetings held subsequently thereto.
- 2. Reports of Officers.
- 3. Reports of Committees.
- 4. Unfinished Business.
- 5. New Business.
- 6. Elections.
- 7. Such other business as may be brought before the membership by the Commodore.
- 8. Adjournment.

In case of dispute as to order and debate, Robert's "Manual of Parliamentary Rules" shall govern.

## Sec. 3. SPECIAL MEETINGS.

- (A) Special meetings of the Club shall be held at such time as may be designated by the Board of Directors, or such meetings shall be held upon call of the Commodore, acting on his own motion, or upon written petition of at least twenty percent (20%) of the Resident Members in good standing.
- (B) At least ten (10) days notice of the time, place, and purpose of a Special Meeting as well as the names of the petitioners shall be given to the members by mail, but failure of any member or members to receive such notice shall not invalidate action taken at such Meeting, provided a quorum is present. The Board of Directors shall cause such notice to be published.
- (C) The Special Meeting shall be held within ninety (90) days of receipt of a valid petition.
- (D) Only the announced and published special business can be discussed.

## Sec. 4. VOTING.

All Resident Members in good standing shall be entitled to vote at meetings of the Club on the business transacted at such meetings. Each such Resident Member present shall be entitled to one vote on all questions put to a vote. The majority vote shall determine the question and issue, unless otherwise specifically provided in the Charter of the Corporation, or in these By-Laws or any amendment thereto. One-fourth of the members in good standing shall constitute a quorum at all meetings of members; provided, however, less than a quorum may adjourn the meeting to a later specified date. Voting shall be by oral ballot with the following exceptions:

- (1) In the election of officers or directors where there are two or more candidates for the respective vacancy to be filled;
- (2) In any case where the voting method is otherwise specified in the relevant By-Law article or section:
- (3) In all other cases in which a motion is adopted for the use of written ballots.

# ARTICLE VII FEES, DUES, and ASSESSMENTS

## Sec. 1. INITIATION FEES AND DUES.

The Club shall charge membership initiation fees, use fees, and dues as deemed necessary and in the best interest of the Club by resolution of the Board of Directors, so long as the percentage changes are no more than the percentage change in the cost of living index\*. Changes not in compliance with this limitation shall be effective only after approval by the membership as defined by Article VI, Sec. 4 VOTING, except that voting shall be by anonymous written ballot. \*Definition of cost of living index: CPI-U, All Items, for the 12 months ending with August of the year preceding the calendar year the proposed fees and/or dues would be due and payable.

(A) Any initiation fee previously paid by a Non-Resident or Student Member shall be credited against the initiation fee in effect at the time of their acceptance to Resident Membership. No additional initiation fees shall be assessed of a member who has paid a Resident Member initiation fee in full so long as a continuous membership status of any type is maintained.

## Sec. 2. PAYMENT OF DUES.

All dues shall become due and payable January 1 for the calendar year beginning on that day.

## Sec. 3. ASSESSMENTS.

After approval by the Membership of each assessment, the Board may assess each and every Resident Member. The total assessments for any calendar year shall not exceed one-third of that Member's annual dues. Voting shall be as defined by Article VI, Sec. 4 VOTING, except that voting shall be by anonymous written ballot.

## Sec. 4. PENALTY FOR NON-PAYMENT OF DUES, ASSESSMENTS AND FINES.

If Dues are not paid within 30 days of the due date or by February 1, or if assessments or fines are not paid within 60 days of the due date, the member is declared delinquent and may be expelled from the Club by the Board of Directors according to the procedure described in Article II, Sec. 9 of these By-Laws.

## Sec. 5. LATE PAYMENT CHARGE.

In the event a member is permitted to continue in membership by payment of delinquent dues, assessments or fines, there shall be added to every delinquent installment of dues, assessments or fines a late payment charge equal to ten percent (10%) of the amount of such installment for each month or part of a month between the time the delinquency occurs and the time it is paid.

# ARTICLE VIII

## AMENDMENT OF BY-LAWS

- (A) Amendments to the By-Laws may be made only upon majority vote at a meeting called in accordance with ARTICLE VI provided that all proposed amendments shall be submitted in writing to the Board of Directors for their approval. Upon approval by the Board of Directors, the proposed amendment shall be submitted at the next Club Meeting for approval by the members.
- (B) The Board of Directors shall cause a notice of a proposed amendment to be mailed to each member at least thirty (30) days prior to a Club Meeting for approval of said amendment.
- (C) If the Board of Directors does not approve the proposed amendment within forty (40) days from its submission to the board, then said amendment may be resubmitted to the Board by petition of no fewer than twenty-five (25) Resident Members in good standing. The Board of Directors shall then cause a notice of the proposed amendment and the names of the petitioners to be mailed to each member at least thirty (30) days prior to a Club Meeting for approval by the membership.
- (D) The proposed amendment shall go into effect immediately after its approval by the membership.

## Addendum to LNYC Bylaws, Adopted Oct. 21, 1990 LAKE NORMAN YACHT CLUB, INC.,

## **CAPITAL TRUST FUND**

The Board of Directors of the Lake Norman Yacht Club, Inc., a North Carolina not-for-profit corporation (hereinafter referred to as "LNYC" or "the Club"), hereby establish this Trust for the uses and purposes set out below. The initial trust shall be a contribution of \$1,000.00 to be made by the Board of Directors from the general funds of LNYC upon this trust becoming effective as provided in Article V.

# ARTICLE I TRUSTEES

## Sec. 1. SELECTION.

The Trust shall be administered and governed by five trustees. All trustees shall be Resident Members of LNYC in good standing. Two of such trustees shall be members of the Board of Directors of the Club and shall serve a term of one year. A Director trustee may serve not more than two consecutive terms. One of the two Director trustees shall be the Second Past Commodore of the Club and the other Director trustee shall be appointed by vote of the Board of Directors of the Club. The three remaining trustees shall not be members of the Board of Directors and each must have been a Resident Member for not less than ten years. The non-Director trustees shall serve staggered terms of three years each. The initial three non-Director trustees shall be selected by a committee appointed by the Commodore of the Club and they shall be designated to serve terms ending on December 31 of 1991, 1992, and 1993. Annually, beginning in 1991, the existing Trustees shall nominate three persons not then serving on

the Board of Directors and the Board of Directors shall select one of the nominees to serve a term of three years to replace the trustee whose term ends on the following December 31. A non-Director trustee may serve not more than two consecutive terms.

In the event of a vacancy among the Trustees, the Board of Directors of the Club shall appoint a Director trustee or non-Director trustee, as the case may be, to complete the term of the departed trustee.

## Sec. 2. DUTIES.

The Trustees shall receive such gifts, donations, legacies, bequests or devises as may be offered to the Trust from time to time. However, the Trustees may decline to accept any such offer if the conditions of such offer, the tax consequences of acceptance, or any other reason in their judgment would make acceptance of the offer inadvisable. The Trustees shall cooperate with prospective donors to secure for the donor all tax benefits which may be lawfully available and not contrary to the best interests of the Trust or the Club.

The Trustees shall hold and invest the funds of the Trust, and disburse the same, in accord with the provisions of this instrument and the laws of the United States and the State of North Carolina. The Trustees shall cause all tax returns required by law to be filed and the taxes due thereon paid from the funds of the Trust.

Each trustee shall be bonded by a surety company acceptable to the Board of Directors of the Club in an amount equal to one and on-half the amount held by the Trust as of the close of the last fiscal year. The premium for such bond shall be paid from the Club's general fund.

The Trustees shall report to the membership of the Club at its annual general meeting as to the financial status and previous year's receipts and expenditures.

## Sec. 3. MEETINGS OF TRUSTEES.

The Trustees shall meet at least annually and such meeting shall be held during the thirty-day period immediately prior to the annual general meeting of the Club's membership. Trustees may meet more often as they see fit. Four trustees shall constitute a quorum. Action by the Trustees shall require a majority vote of those Trustees present at a meeting. The Trustees may also take action without a meeting by signing their consent to a resolution or memorandum of such action provided at least three Trustees consent to the action and provided all Trustees have been notified of the proposed action.

## Sec. 4. TRUST ACCOUNTING.

The Trustees shall maintain appropriate records of donations and other receipts and disbursements, segregating on such records principal from income. As used herein, the term "principal" shall mean the amount of donations of money or other liquid assets or the fair market value of donations of other property; the term "income" shall refer to interest, dividends and other return on investment, including capital gain, and all other receipts. Except as provided below, all expenditures shall be charged against income.

## ARTICLE II TRUST PURPOSES

## Sec. 1. GENERAL

The general purpose of this Trust is to provide a vehicle by which persons may make donations of money or property for the benefit of the Club. Except as provided in Section 3 below, all disbursements shall be from income only and must be used only for capital improvements. The term "capital improvements" as used herein shall include construction, enlargement or improvement of buildings or other structures of a permanent nature; landscaping (but not including routine maintenance); the purchase of real property; the purchase of vessels, whether for use by race committees or competitors (e.g., for the Junior Program or other Clubsponsored competition or program); the purchase of other durable property for use in Club activities; and the satisfaction of debt incurred for any capital improvement. The foregoing list is intended to be illustrative but not exclusive, and any expenditure resulting in the acquisition or betterment of property of a more-or-less permanent nature qualifies as a capital improvement.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, if a donor of a gift has so provided, disbursements may be made from income or principal and used for any purpose designated by the donor.

## Sec. 2. COMMINGLING.

Funds held by the trust shall not be commingled with the funds of the Club and in no event shall funds of the trust be used for the operating or general budget of the Club.

## Sec. 3. INVASIONS OF PRINCIPAL.

In extraordinary circumstances, the Trustees may recommend that an amount not exceeding twenty-five percent (25%) of the trust principal be disbursed for a specified purpose. Upon the approval of a two-thirds majority of the membership of the Club present at a general meeting of the membership, the Trustees shall be authorized to make such disbursement from principal, not to exceed twenty-five percent of the trust principal. This section does not apply to gifts designated by the donor as one from which disbursements of principal may be made.

# ARTICLE III INVESTMENTS

The Trustees are authorized to invest the trust assets in any reasonable manner and shall be liable only for loss resulting from gross negligence or intentional wrongdoing.

Within the limitations of that standard, the Trustees may acquire and retain every kind of property and every kind of investment, including but not limited to bonds, debentures, and other corporate or governmental obligations; stocks, preferred or common; real estate; real estate mortgages; shares in building and loan associations or savings and loan associations; securities of any management type investment company or investment trust registered under the Federal Investment Company Act of 1940, as from time to time amended.

Notwithstanding any provision in this instrument and notwithstanding any contrary provision of law, the Trustees shall be deemed to be fiduciaries only with respect to the Board of Directors of the Club, and not to the membership generally nor to any individual member of the Club, except in case of fraud or collusion between the Trustees (or any of them) and the Board of Directors of the Club.

#### ARTICLE IV

### TERMINATION AND AMENDMENT OF TRUST

## Sec. 1. TERMINATION OF LNYC.

In the event LNYC ceases to exist without a successor organization, as defined herein, then the assets then held by the Trustees shall be disbursed to US Sailing or to its successor organization, if any, and this trust shall terminate. The term "successor organization", as used with reference to LNYC, shall mean any sailboat racing organization on Lake Norman (or, if Lake Norman has ceased to exist, on any body of water within fifty miles of the present LNYC Clubhouse) composed of at least fifty percent (50%) of the persons who were Resident Members of LNYC during its last twelve months of existence.

### Sec. 2. BY MEMBERSHIP.

This trust may be amended, including termination, by vote of at least seventy-five percent (75%) of the total Resident Membership of LNYC.

### Sec. 3. RULE AGAINST PERPETUITIES.

In the event this instrument or any provision herein in the absence of this Section 3 of Article IV violates the Rule Against Perpetuities, then this trust shall automatically terminate twenty-one (21) years after the death of the last to die of Patrick Stewart Stokes, Jordyn Paige Harrison, Miranda Ashely Mayes, Susan Tucker Kornegay, Natalie Elizabeth Vitez, Amanda Marie Robinson, or Brett Allen Fox. In such event the trust assets shall pass to the general fund of LNYC free of this trust.

### ARTICLE V EFFECTIVE DATE

This trust shall become effective upon approval by a majority vote of the membership of LNYC at a general meeting of the membership. The Bylaws of the Club shall be deemed to incorporate the terms hereof to the extent necessary to provide for the appointment of Trustees and otherwise implement the provisions hereof.

ADOPTED BY VOTE OF THE LNYC MEMBERSHIP AT THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING ON OCTOBER 21, 1990.

### **CLUB RULES**

- 1. No guests are permitted to use the Club unless accompanied by a member.
- 2. Members shall be responsible for the behavior of their guests at all times.
- 3. No pets are allowed on the Club property.
- 4. The gate will be closed and locked by the last group leaving each day.
- 5. Any articles left at the Club will be put in a "Lost and Found" box and disposed of after a reasonable interval.
- 6. The Club is not responsible for boats, personal property or the personal liability of members or guests. Specifically, the Club is not responsible for the personal liability of any member or guest; as well as any loss, theft, or damage of any personal items stored or used at the Club. This includes but is not limited to boats, motors, sails, trailers, campers, tents, clothing, etc. It is the individual responsibility of each member to carry insurance against such losses.
- 7. A member may invite to the Club at any time a guest who is a non-resident of the area. A member may invite to the Club one weekend in any calendar month a guest who is a resident of the area, and such guest may not be invited by another member in that calendar month. This restriction shall not apply to a member's crew.
- 8. All special events involving non-members such as class regattas, parties utilizing club facilities, etc., require approval in advance. See section, "Use of Club Facilities by Non-Member Groups."
- 9. Membership cards shall be issued and must be exhibited on request of any member.
- 10. Club keys must not be lent to non-members except when contracting work is necessary.
- 11. No member shall bring more than six guests at any time without making arrangements with the Chairman of the House Committee.
- 12. No college student or teenage parties shall be held on Club property without sufficient member chaperons. There will be absolutely no teenage drinking. Violations of this rule by any member may be cause for immediate expulsion of that member.
- 13. Parents are responsible for the supervision and conduct of their children at all times.

### USE OF CLUB FACILITIES BY NON-MEMBER GROUPS

The objective of these regulations is to provide a service to members by allowing them to entertain large groups at the club, so long as such activity does not unduly infringe upon the use of the club facilities by other members. These regulations apply to functions held or sponsored by members for their own purposes (e.g. office parties, private social events, etc.) and do not apply to use of the club by outside organizations as permitted by the Board of Directors.

- 1. Application must be made to the Vice Commodore and include a signed form accepting responsibility for breakage, and releasing LNYC from any liability.
- 2. No two activities requiring use of club facilities may be scheduled on the same day.
- 3. Use of club facilities by outside groups will not be permitted on Friday, Saturday, or Sunday between the spring club commissioning and the fall annual meeting except with the approval of the Board of Directors.
- 4. Regattas and other sailing activities take precedence over purely social activities.
- 5. Exclusive use of facilities is not permitted by any group.
- 6. One member must assume liability for the entire event, including clean-up activity.
- 7. The club facilities must be left in a clean and orderly condition.
- 8. Whenever possible, the name of the responsible party, name of the group, time, date, and facility being used should be published in the Signal prior to the event.
- 9. The club facilities may not be used for an activity which requires fees paid to other organizations and/or for commercial purposes.
- 10. A fee of \$5 per non-member must be forwarded to the Club Treasurer within 30 days of the event.

### **CAMPING RULES**

- 1. A proper request form must be completed and approved for a new Camp Site before the camper can be located at LNYC. If a Camp Site is not available, the Camping Chairman shall maintain a Camp Site Application Waiting List.
- 2. Camping will be permitted only in areas designated specifically for camping. Exception may be granted for regattas by the Regatta Camping Chairman. All temporary or overflow camping units shall be removed at the conclusion of the event.
- 3. Tents and trailers are not to be left set up in the camping areas indefinitely. Each Camp Site shall be vacated annually in advance of each spring workday to facilitate site cleanup and to demonstrate that equipment is being kept in a roadworthy condition.
- 4. To maintain a Camp Site assignment, the member must maintain legal ownership of the RV or trailer.
- 5. During the club sailing season, camping units must be used for overnight camping each month. When other members are waiting for assigned Camp Sites, those members who violate this rule will be required to vacate their assigned Camp Sites and to remove their equipment.
- 6. Campers are responsible for policing the areas used by campers, keeping them clean and orderly, including grass mowing.
- 7. No structure may be erected in the camping area without written approval of the Board.
- 8. No boat or trailer storage is permitted at Camp Sites.
- 9. Quiet hours in camping areas are from 10:00 pm until 8:00 am.
- 10. Ground fires are not permitted in camping areas.
- 11. All camping units must be labeled with the owner's name and telephone number.

- 12. Camping neighbors shall be respected.
- 13. RVs and trailers shall be maintained in a clean, legal, and roadworthy condition at all times, with their wheels on, tires inflated, and hitches in safe working condition. Legal is defined as having a current license tag. Roadworthy is defined as being able to remove any supports, hook up to a vehicle, and tow on public roads without any obvious repairs or effort.
- 14. Camp Sites are allotted on a year-to-year basis to present occupants, provided the occupant complies with all provisions in the camping rules. Any deviation requires Board approval.
- 15. The Camping Chairman shall maintain a Camp Site Occupancy Listing that will be posted at the Pavilion.
- 16. Camp Site occupancy shall not change without prior approval of the Camping Chairman.
- 17. No member may occupy more than one site while other members are on the waiting list for a Camp Site.
- 18. A camper holding an assigned site may voluntarily vacate it temporarily for an agreed period (for vacation, trailer maintenance, etc.) and in so doing shall notify the Camping Chairman.
- 19. A temporarily vacated Camp Site may be assigned temporarily for an agreed period to a family on the waiting list with the understanding that at the end of the agreed period the site will be vacated and returned to the original occupant.
- 20. Members who already have an assigned Camp Site may request a change of Camp Site by writing to the Camping Chairman, who shall maintain a list of such requests. When a Camp Site is vacated permanently by the former occupant, the Camping Chairman shall offer the vacant site to all members on the Campsite Change Request List in the order of 1) active campers, 2) active sailors, 3) the date of their request for change.
- 21. After going through the Camp Site Change Request List, a vacated Camp Site shall be assigned to applicants on the Camp Site Application Waiting List. Priority will be given to members that 1) are generally a further distance from the club (not actual distance; less than 10 miles difference is considered the same general distance) from the club, 2) active sailors (active is defined as participating in at least 50% of the club series weekends), 3) date of application.
- 22. Due to the limited number of Camp Sites able to accommodate very long trailers or campers, the Board reserves the right to restrict Camp Sites to equipment measuring not more than 26 feet from rear bumper to front towing hitch. Exceptions to this rule require special approval from the Board of Directors and the availability of a site long enough to safely accommodate the equipment.
- 23. Camp Sites 1 though 6 will be designated for pop up campers only.

#### **GROUNDS**

- 1. Cars and trailers shall be parked properly in the designated areas. Roads, ramps and maneuvering areas shall be kept clear at all times.
- 2. Boats left at the Club shall be stowed neatly and only in the boat park areas, or if assigned by Dry Storage Chairman, and all auxiliary equipment left in or on the boat.
- 3. All trash shall be placed in the appropriate cans provided.
- 4. No trees or shrubs may be cut or broken.

#### **DINGHY RACK RULES**

- 1. **Assigned Rack Space**: Boats will be stored only on racks assigned by the Dinghy Rack Chairperson. Priority of rack assignments will be given to boats that are actively sailed. Requests for rack assignments should be directed to the Dinghy Rack Chairperson prior to storing the boat on the rack.
- 2. **Occupancy List**: The Dinghy Rack Chairperson shall maintain a Dinghy Rack Occupancy List. A copy of the list will be posted at the pavilion.
- 3. **Boat Condition**: Boats stored shall be in a seaworthy condition and comply with any applicable requirements of the NC Wildlife Resources Commission. If a boat is deemed not to be seaworthy or not in compliance with the NC Wildlife Resources Commission requirements by the Dinghy Rack Chairperson, or by Vice Commodore, the member will be required to take corrective action within 30 days of notification or remove it from the grounds until restored to sailing / seaworthy condition and / or registration requirements have been met. Such notification will be in writing and approved by the Board of Directors.
- 4. Covers: If a cover is used, it shall be kept in good condition and any cover should not interfere with other boats on the racks.
- 5. **Identification**: Each boat shall have the decal provided by the Dingy Rack Chairperson displayed on the boat's transom.

### **DRY-STORAGE RULES**

- 1. A proper request form must be completed and approved for a new Dry Storage space before the boat and/or trailer can be located at LNYC.
- 2. **Assigned Storage Space:** Boats and trailers will stored only in spaces assigned by the Dry Storage Chairperson. Priority of dry storage will be given to boats that are 1) active racing sailboats (active is defined as participating in at least 50% of the club series weekends) 2) sailboats dry sailed from trailers, 3) trailers for boats in assigned keelboat slips, 4) multiple Dry Storage spaces for a member. Within each category, priority shall be by SNAP #. Requests for space assignments should be directed to the Dry Storage Chairperson prior to storing the boat on the grounds. If for some reason a boat must be stored prior to having a space assigned it should be staged in the boat repair area and a request made to the Dry Storage Chairperson immediately. Each boat shall be centered in its assigned space with the trailer tongue over but not on the numbered plaque. No boat or trailer may be stored in the clubhouse parking lot.

- 3. Occupancy List: The Dry Storage Chairperson shall maintain a Dry Storage Occupancy List. A copy of the list will be posted at the Pavilion. To maintain a Dry Storage space assignment, the member must maintain legal ownership of the boat and/or trailer. Under no conditions will any member sublet a dry storage space.
  - 4. **Boat Condition and Registration Requirements:** Boats stored shall be in a legal and seaworthy condition and comply with any applicable requirements of the NC Wildlife Resources Commission. Legal is defined as having a current registration sticker or evidence of US Coast Guard vessel documentation. Seaworthy is defined as being able to launch and go sailing on public waters without any obvious repairs or effort. If the Dry Storage Chairperson of the Vice Commodore deem that a boat is not seaworthy or is not in compliance with the requirements of the NC Wildlife Resources Commission, the member will required to take corrective action within 30 days of written notification or remove it from the grounds until restored to a sailing/seaworthy condition and/or registration requirements have been met.
  - 5. Power Boats: A member may not be assigned more than one Dry Storage space for a power boat and/or power boat trailer.
  - 6. Trailers: All trailers stored at the club must be legal and roadworthy. Legal is defined as having a current license plate. Roadworthy is defined as being able to hook up to a vehicle and tow on public roads without any obvious repairs or effort. If a trailer is deemed unroadworthy, the member will be required to follow the same rules as for an unseaworthy boat. For an empty trailer to be stored at the Club the member must have the boat stored at LNYC. All trailers that do not have a designated boat at LNYC must be removed.
  - 7. Names On Trailers: No trailer will be allowed in storage that does not have the LNYC member's name displayed on the tongue. Names shall be applied with either paint or vinyl lettering.
  - 8. **Repairs:** Boats and/or trailers under repair shall be temporarily stored in the repair area until repairs are complete. The repair area is that area on the northeast side of the club easily identified by the A-frame and gin pole.

### **Dry-Storage Designated Areas:**

- A. ALPHA AREA (13 spaces) A-1 thru A-13 Right side of road leading from clubhouse parking lot to the committee shed road. Area is primarily designated for 26' and above boats that are dry sailed. (e.g. Ultimate 20)
- B. BRAVO AREA (26 spaces) B-1 thru B-26 Left side of road leading from clubhouse parking lot to the main entrance gates. Area is designated as miscellaneous class area, but primarily for 22' and larger dry-sailed boats.
- C. CHARLIE AREA (19 spaces) C-1 thru C-19 Right side of road leading from main entrance gate road towards pavilion area. Area is primarily designated as miscellaneous class area, but primarily for less than 22' dry sailed.
- D. DELTA AREA (28 spaces) D-1 thru D-28 Right side of main point road up to first launch area access road. Area is designated for one-design dry-sailed boats. (i.e. Scots, Highlanders, Thistles, Lasers, etc.)
- E. ECHO AREA (19 spaces) E-1 thru E-19 Right side of road between two launch area access roads (facing SE). Area is also designated for one-design dry-sailed boats.
- F. FOX-TROT AREA (10 Spaces) F-1 thru F-10 Right side of the point, facing SE. Area is designated for one-designs and multi-hulls.
- G. GOLF AREA (9 spaces) G-1 thru G-9 Left side of the point, facing NW (across from Area F). Area is designated for onedesigns and multi-hulls.
- H. HOTEL AREA (21 spaces) H-1 thru H-21 Clubhouse side of parking island south of the boat maintenance area. Area has open designation. (Trailers and boats on trailers.)
- I. INDIA AREA (24 spaces) I-1 thru I-24 The backside next to the road by the woods south of the boat maintenance area. (Backs up to H Area.) Same designation as H Area.
- J. JULIET AREA (35 spaces) J-1 thru J-35 Along the point road, from the gin pole to the entrance to the camping area behind the pavilion. (Directly across the road from D Area)

### **HOUSE RULES**

### **General Rules**

- The Clubhouse and Pavilion exist to support the activities of the club and it's members.
- Each member shall cooperate in seeing that the Clubhouse and Pavilion are kept neat and must cleanup after each use.
- All maintenance needs of the Clubhouse and Pavilion shall be promptly reported to the appropriate committee chairman.
- No Clubhouse or Pavilion equipment shall be removed without permission of the Clubhouse or Pavilion Chairman.
- All appliances, plumbing fixtures, lights, etc. shall be checked after each use to ensure they are left in a safe and economical condition.
- All inside and outside trash and garbage shall be removed and deposited in the appropriate dumpsters after each function.
- The last one leaving the Clubhouse or Pavilion each night should evaluate the need to close all windows and lock doors and do so when appropriate.
- As items are used from Club first aid kits, needs to replace those items should be reported to the Club Safety Officer.

### **Clubhouse Rules**

- Responsibility for the operation and maintenance of the Clubhouse is that of the Vice Commodore and House Chairman.
- No changes / modifications to Clubhouse furnishings or décor shall be made without approval from the House Chairman.
- Kitchen supplies are for use at club sponsored functions only. Those responsible for fleet and individual uses shall either provide their own supplies (eating utensils, kitchen supplies, etc.) or compensate the club.

- 4. No personal equipment shall be stored in the Clubhouse overnight.
- 5. Notices posted by individuals shall be placed on designated bulletin boards. All other notices posted by individuals require approval by the Chairman of the House Committee.
- 6. No ship's gear may be left in the Clubhouse during the day.
- 7. Use of the Clubhouse for living quarters is not allowed.

#### **Pavilion Rules**

- 1. Responsibility for the operation and maintenance of the Pavilion is that of the Vice Commodore and Pavilion Chairman.
- 2. The bathhouse facilities at the Pavilion are winterized in late fall and dewinterized early spring. Use of bathhouse facilities is prohibited during this period of time.
- 3. All spars / rigging stored at the Pavilion shall be clearly marked with the members name or SNAP number.
- 4. No personal storage should be placed in areas used for club mowers, Junior race committee equipment and other club supplies.
- 5. Club equipment such as mowers, Junior race committee equipment, etc. shall be returned to the appropriate place after use.

#### SAFETY AND BOATING

- 1. No child under 18 may use the Club unless accompanied by a responsible adult at all times.
- 2. Children under 8 years should be kept away from the launch ramp at all times, and those under 5 years must wear a life preserver when on the docks. The ultimate responsibility, however, lies with the parents.
- 3. There shall be no swimming off the ramp, docks, or elsewhere other than the designated areas.
- 4. All boats must remain outside the designated swimming area.
- 5. Fires are permitted only in the areas designated and shall be drenched before leaving property.
- 6. Both ramps are designed to accommodate two boats simultaneously; please use only one side when launching. Ramps and launching areas should be used only for launching, and any rigging, etc., should be done in the boat-park areas.
- 7. N.C. Wildlife and U.S. Coast Guard regulations require the following equipment on board: U.S.C.G.-approved life jacket for each person aboard, paddle, anchor, 50-foot towline, U.S.C.G.-approved throwable device, and, for boats over 16 feet, an audible device.
- 8. If foul weather gear is worn in summer or winter, on centerboards or keelboats, it is strongly recommended that a life jacket be worn. It is difficult or impossible to swim or stay afloat in foul weather gear.

### 9. COLD-WEATHER SAILING WARNING:

Yacht Club equipment is not in the same state of readiness or availability outside the normal sailing season. Lake Norman water temperature will likely remain below 60 degrees until May. Cold-weather sailing with the water temperature below 60 degrees should be engaged in only upon the exercise of extreme caution. Should the water temperature be below 50 degrees F., all participants sailing centerboards should wear U.S.C.G.-approved buoyant devices and a wet suit covering the body trunk and extremities.

When a race or group sailing activity is in preparation or progress, at least two rescue boats manned by an able crew of two adults each should be readily available in the sailing area.

### POLICY ON USE OF ALCOHOL

Conviviality and partying are part of our life together. To assure that we:

- a. use alcohol responsibly,
- b. support our Junior Program by being effective role models,
- c. provide alternatives for those who do not or cannot consume alcoholic beverages, and
- d. reduce our liability danger, this policy provides guidelines for alcoholic beverage use at functions organized and sanctioned by LNYC. This policy's purpose is to encourage responsibility among those who use alcohol.
- 1. At LNYC functions and other activities held on our property, all beverages must be clearly and visibly labeled "alcohol" or "no alcohol."
- 2. Whenever alcoholic beverages are served, non-alcoholic beverages must be served with the same attractiveness and accessibility, and in sufficient quantity to meet demand.
- 3. Every effort should be made to publicize an event so that we don't advertise or encourage alcohol use only ("free beer and iced tea" is satisfactory).
- 4. The persons responsible for a function held on LNYC property at which the serving of alcoholic beverages occurs must ensure that the use conforms to this policy and all laws. North Carolina law prohibits selling or serving any alcoholic drink to anyone under age 21.
- 5. Members and guests may bring alcoholic beverages to LNYC for personal use.
- 6. Excessive use of alcohol is unacceptable behavior.

FOLLOWING THESE RULES WILL HELP

CONTINUE OUR TRADITION OF EXCELLENCE.

### SLIP AND PIER REGULATIONS AND ADMINISTRATION

LNYC provides a limited number of permanent slips for members. Docks and slips fall under the purview of the Rear Commodore, who will be responsible for assigning slips and enforcing slip and pier regulations.

### 1. ASSIGNMENT OF SLIPS TO NEW APPLICANTS:

- a. Slips will be assigned only to LNYC members. To be eligible for assignment of a slip, the member must own the boat to be moored in the slip. If the boat is co-owned, all co-owners must be members of LNYC. Slip assignment will be based on a number of factors, including but not limited to, length, beam width, displacement and draft of the boat.
- b. If all slips are assigned, a waiting list will be maintained with position of this list based on order of receipt of application. The waiting list shall be published in the Signal each time it changes.
- c. Application for a slip must be made in writing to the Rear Commodore. The member's name, boat type, length, beam width, displacement and draft of the boat must be included, and whether shore power is required. When a slip is available for assignment, the Rear Commodore shall give notice of availability to the applicant entitled to priority and a copy shall be provided to the LNYC Treasurer. Within 10 days after receiving the notification, the applicant shall pay to the Rear Commodore the fees required by these regulations, and the Rear Commodore shall officially assign the slip to the applicant. The Rear Commodore shall forward all funds received to the LNYC Treasurer.
- d. If payment of all fees is not made within the time required, the applicant shall forfeit his or her priority on the waiting list and must make a new application for a slip assignment.

### 2. OCCUPANCY OF SLIPS:

- a. To maintain a slip a member must, in addition to meeting the other requirements of these regulations, maintain legal ownership of the boat, solely or in partnership with other LNYC members. No boat owned in whole or part by a non-member may be moored in a slip.
  - b. Any slip that remains substantially unoccupied is subject to being sub-assigned in accordance with Section 2.e.
- c. All boats occupying slips shall be maintained in sailable condition as a condition for continuing assignment of a slip. Failure to do so is grounds for ineligibility of continuing the slip assignment as per Section 2.d.
- d. Any time the Rear Commodore has reason to believe that a slip holder is ineligible to maintain a slip other than for non-payment of slip fees, he shall interview the slip holder and determine whether the slip holder is entitled to maintain the slip. If the Rear Commodore determines that a slip holder is not entitled to maintain the slip, he shall so notify the slip holder in writing stating the reason or reasons therefore. A slip holder shall vacate the slip with 10 days after an adverse determination. The slip rental fee shall be prorated from the date the slip is vacated or the date of such determination, whichever is later, and refunded to the member. If the slip is not vacated in the appropriate time, LNYC may begin adverse possession remedies at that time.
- e. Slips are not assignable or transferable by a member. Slips that are vacant for extended periods of time may be sub-assigned on a temporary basis by the Rear Commodore. Such action shall be taken only after consultation with the slip holder. In the event a slip is sub-assigned, the slip holder will give the Rear Commodore 30 days notice when he or she wishes to reoccupy the slip so that other arrangements can be made. The Rear Commodore shall offer the slip on a temporary basis to persons on the slip waiting list in descending order. These persons shall be advised of the temporary nature of the sib-assignment, and of the requirement that they be prepared to vacate the sub-assigned slip on a 30 days notice; and they will not lose their position on the slip waiting list.

### 3. SLIP FEES AND RENTALS:

- a. Each new applicant for a slip assignment shall be assessed a Slip Initiation Fee, due and payable before any slip assignment is made, as provided in Section 1 of these regulations. The amount of this fee shall be set by the LNYC Board of Directors before January 1 of the year the fee is effective and published in the LNYC Yearbook. The Board of Directors may modify or set fees at any time, as necessary. The Slip Initiation Fee shall not apply for a change of slips.
- b. All members who are assigned slips shall pay an annual slip rental fee due and payable in advance on January 1<sup>st</sup> for the calendar year beginning on that day. Those assigned to slips with 30-amp shore power on "B" dock shall pay electrical services charges, in addition. When a slip is assigned mid-year, the amount of the slip rental fee and, if applicable, the electrical service charge for the current year shall be prorated, and for that purpose the month in which the Rear Commodore initially notifies an applicant of slip availability shall be counted as a full month remaining in that year. The amount of the annual rental fee and electrical service charge shall be set be the LNYC Board of Directors prior to January 1 of the year the fee is effective and shall be published in the LNYC Yearbook. The Board of Directors may also modify or set additional fees as necessary.
- c. Payment of all slip rentals, except the initial fees which are payable to the Rear Commodore at the time of assignment, shall be made to the LNYC Assistant Treasurer.
- d. In the event the LNYC Assistant Treasurer does not receive payment of any slip fees within 30 days after such payment is due, he shall notify the member that if payment is not received within 15 days of the date of such notification, the slip will be declared vacant and available to other members in accordance with these regulations. If payment is not then received within the 15 day period, the Assistant Treasurer shall so notify the Rear commodore who shall declare the slip vacant. In addition to the

foregoing action, the Board of Directors may assert and enforce a lien, as provide by law, against the vessel occupying a slip for which the slip fee or slip rental remains unpaid more than 30 days after it is due, and the Board of Directors may also dismiss the delinquent member from the Club in the same manner as provided in the By-laws for non-payment of annual membership dues. Provided, however, that no member may be dismissed under this provision if he or she gives notice to the Rear Commodore of intention to relinquish the slip. Such notice must be in writing, and must be given prior to the due day of the slip fee or slip rental, and the slip must be evacuated prior to such due date.

e. Slip fees and slip rentals shall not be refundable in whole or in part except as provided in Section 2.d. above or as may be directed by the Board of Directors.

### 4. CHANGE OF SLIPS:

- a. Members who wish to change their assigned slip for another shall make request in writing to the Rear Commodore. Priority for slip changes by members shall be by LNYC SNAP number.
- b. A list showing the names in order of SNAP number shall be published in the Signal each time a slip change is authorized or an additional request change is received. When any slip becomes vacant, the Rear Commodore shall offer it to the senior most member on the Slip Change List who has a boat of a size appropriate to the slip. If that member declines the slip, the Rear Commodore shall proceed down the list in order of seniority, offering the slip to members with appropriately sized boats. If none of them exercise their option to assume the vacant slip, it shall be offered to members on the Slip Waiting List. Slip changes will only be made for members on the Slip Change List.
- c. The Board of Directors specifically empowers the Rear Commodore to make changes in slip assignments at any time as may be necessary to ensure the greatest possible utilization of slips by members.

### 5. SLIP ASSIGNMENT CHART:

- a. A Slip Assignment chart shall be maintained by the Rear Commodore, and each time a change is made it shall be reissued, dated, and posted in the Clubhouse and on the Keelboat bulletin board.
- b. The Slip Assignment Chart shall show the location of each slip, the name of the member, boat type, and the member's home and business telephone member.

### 6. SECURITY OF BOATS:

a. All boats shall be secured by a minimum of two bow lines, two stern lines and two spring lines of nylon three strand or nylon braided line in sizes as follows:

Boat Length less than 30 feet, 1/2"

Boat Length greater than 30 feet, 5/8"

No monofilament material shall be used.

Snubbers of the Elvstrom type, appropriate size for the line, must be used on each line securing a boat to the pier. Chafe tubing or other chafe protection is required on all mooring lines that pass through chocks on board the boat. If feasible, lines to the pier are to be crossed to allow proper freedom of movement for the boat.

- b. On pilings, a bowline through a floating tire ring buoy is required.
- c. All lines shall be maintained in good condition and replaced when necessary by the boat-owner using seamanlike judgment. This means replacing the line if there is any question of the line's integrity.
- d. It is the responsibility of each member to insure that the condition of the boat's lines is proper and in accordance with these specifications at all times.

#### 7. MAINTENANCE OF BOAT SECURITY:

The Keelboat Fleet Captain, LNYC Dock Committee chairman, and LNYC Rear Commodore and his designees are authorized to board any member's boat when the owner is not present and replace any line which is suspected to be in poor condition. Both the member and the LNYC Treasurer shall be notified of such replacement and the cost thereof. The member shall remit the cost of the new line to the Treasurer. Any and all liability for such action shall remain with the owner of the boat.

### 8. USE AND MAINTENANCE OF PIER AND UTILITIES:

- a. No structural or accessory addition or modification may be made to the dock system. This includes but is not limited to carpet on pilings, bolt eyes, nails, etc.
- b. Batten strips of  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " by  $3\frac{3}{4}$ " salt treated limber may be installed on pilings for hull protection. No other material shall be mounted on the pilings.
- c. Electrical power provided by the Club at the lighting locations is intended for tool and boat maintenance use and not for major appliances. It is not intended to be nor should it be considered "shore power". The system will accommodate only minimal wattage, Full 30-amp shore power is available only at selected "B" dock slips.

### d. Water is for boat washing and is **NOT POTABLE.**

### RADIO COMMUNICATIONS

- A. Turn on radios and adjust as follows:
  - 1. Set HI-LOW power switch to LOW position.
  - 2. Rotate squelch control fully counter-clockwise.
  - 3. Rotate volume control clockwise (about 1/2 turn).
  - 4. Rotate squelch control clockwise until "hash" drops out (about 1/2 turn).

### B. Channel selection

- 1. All radios, including the radio in the clubhouse, should normally be set to operate on Channel 71.
- 2. The monitor receiver in the clubhouse shall monitor channel 16, the distress and calling channel. For short periods of time when weather conditions are threatening, this monitor receiver may be switched threatening this monitor receiver may be switched to the weather channel.
- 3. 3. If radio contact cannot be established by any station, that station should go to channel 16 to receive instructions from the Race Committee Chairman or to verify that the working channel is channel 71.

#### D. Station Identification

The full identification of any LNYC station includes the station call "WTD 3446" and the boat designation. Therefore, if you are aboard Race 5 and you wish to contact your PRO on Race 1, the transmission would read "WTD 3446, Race 1, this is WTD 3446, Race 5."

Identify your station call sign fully every fourth or fifth transmission. For intermediate transmissions, you can say, for example, "Race 1, this is Race 5." Sign off at the end of the day's racing by saying, "This is WTD 3446, Race 1, off and clear."

E. All Race Committee members are to become familiar with any additional instructions found in the Clubhouse and Race Management Center.


